- <u>Sports Competitions –</u> Well done to all those that attended last week's athletics' competition with Legacy Sports!
- School Drive A gentle reminder that the school drive should not be accessed between 8.25-9.15am and 2.55-3.25pm to ensure that children and adults can walk to and from school safely during the busy periods. If you do use the drive outside of these hours, please use the parking bays to park vehicles in between the lines and park considerately for all users and neighbours.
- <u>Highways and Traffic Safety update from the Parish Council</u>. On behalf of the Paris Council we are pleased to share an update regarding important highways and traffic safety improvements that affect our village and school community. These matters have been previously discussed with the School Council, and I know many of you will be interested in the progress being made:

Speed Monitoring on Wentedge Road: Excessive speeds were recorded where the 30mph zone starts and ends. To address this, North Yorkshire Council has proposed a traffic calming scheme, including the installation of rumble strips on the approach to the village. This project will be submitted for planning approval and, if approved, should be implemented in the new budget year starting in April.

20mph Zone Near the School: Monitoring near the school showed average speeds of around 20mph. Based on this, North Yorkshire Council plans to apply for approval to establish a formal 20mph zone through the village, specifically before and after the school. They will inform residents and the school community about this proposal around March, and your support will be crucial at that time.

Double Yellow Lines: The Parish Council has also followed up on the installation of double yellow lines on the bends before and after the school. North Yorkshire Council is reviewing this and will provide an update shortly.

Footpath and Bridleway Proposal: There is an ongoing proposal to connect Wentbridge to Kirk Smeaton via a safe footpath and bridleway. This initiative, currently under review, is being led by the quarry in consultation with local councils. If approved, it will improve pedestrian safety and address drainage issues along the road.

While progress can sometimes be slow due to budget constraints, it is encouraging to see these important issues being addressed. The Parish Council continues to work hard to make our village safer for everyone, and we are pleased to share their ongoing efforts with you. I hope our School Council and Eagles class, who have been learning about the role of the Parish Council, will find these updates both informative and inspiring. Thank you for your continued support in keeping our school community safe.

- Meal choices for January 2025 onwards are now available to select on the portal. Even if your child is on a
 packed lunch, please select this option from the menu. Please ensure all choices are made by Friday 20th
 December, to allow an accurate food delivery for the new term.

- For those that pay for school meals, please ensure that your balance is topped up regularly.

General Reminders

- <u>Mobile Library</u> North Yorkshire's Mobile Library is in the village on the 7th January. There a number of outstanding books on loan to the children which are now overdue. Please have a look at home and return any books back into school.
- <u>School Winter Uniform -</u> All pupils must wear black sensible school shoes (not trainers) for indoor and general outdoor use. Children may wear wellingtons to and from school, but must change into school shoes

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- once they are in the classroom. From November to March we ask that children wear trousers or tights to keep warm in the winter months and have an outdoor coat which can be fastened.
- **Sport Competitions.** If your child has been on competition and used the schools kit, please wash it and return it ASAP so that other children can wear it for the next competition please.
- Parking- a polite reminder to all parents and carers, please park responsibly. The Shoulder of Mutton Pub kindly allow parking for drop off and pick ups at school.
- <u>Collective worship</u> Parents and carers are invited to attend the SHINE collective worship every Monday at 2.30pm. This is a Collective worship where we recognise the achievements for the week.
- <u>School Fundraising Group</u> We are deeply grateful to parents and friends for fundraising efforts, which allow us to afford many luxuries for our children. We are seeking parents and carers to lead the fundraising group next year. If you are interested, please let the school office know.
- <u>Jewellery in school</u> Can we please remind parents of the school's earrings and jewellery policy in school, in that we do not allow jewellery to be worn in school with the exception of a wristwatch, which must be removed for PE. We ask that any piercings are done in the school holidays so that they can be removed in time for school.
