LO: To start to write a story

It might be worth creating a story map first as this will help to order your thoughts. It does not need to be pages and pages of writing as you should be more focussed on the quality of writing.

Therefore, I would like to see you using:

- Fronted adverbials (with commas),
- Subordinating conjunctions,
- Expanded noun phrases,
- Adverbs and accurate punctuation.

If you feel like challenging yourself, think about adding speech marks, similes or alliteration.



Tuesday 21st April 2020

LO: To complete my story

You should complete the story that you started yesterday, making sure that you have included all of the success criteria below.

Therefore I would like to see you using:

- Fronted adverbials (with commas),
- Subordinating conjunctions,
- Expanded noun phrases,
- Adverbs and accurate punctuation.

Challenge - speech marks, similes or alliteration.

Use a different coloured pen to edit your work so that we can see that changes that you have made. It is always worth looking to add synonyms! Your word choices are what make it interesting to the reader.



Wednesday 22nd April 2020

LO: To use descriptive writing

Following these instructions, write your own paragraph that clearly explains what you think life would be like if dinosaurs were still around today.

Think carefully about your choice of adjectives and use a thesaurus to see if you can find any other alternatives.

Thursday 23rd April 2020

LO: To write a diary entry

Yesterday, you worked hard to create a descriptive paragraph about what life would be like if dinosaurs were still around today.


Today, you will be using this work to write a diary entry. Tell me about an incident that may have happened between you and a dinosaur...

This week you have worked on a fictional diary entry. Today, I would like you to write your own diary entry about your time learning from home this week. Remember to write in paragraphs using a number of sentences for each paragraph.

If you are struggling to think of paragraphs for your diary entry, here are some examples that you could use:

- Things that you have found difficult and how you have overcome this;
- Something new that you have learnt;
- Something that you are looking forward to and why;
