

## Pupil Premium Funding – Academic Year September 2020 to July 2021

Primary schools receive the following funding for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years:

- £1,345 for pupils in reception year to year 6

Schools will receive £1,900 for each pupil who has left local-authority care because of 1 of the following:

- adoption
- a special guardianship order
- a child arrangements order
- a residence order

Schools receive £310 for each child who is classed as a service child.

### The school amount for this year is £9100.

<p><b>Attendance</b> Statistically there is a gap between pupil premium and non-pupil premium attendance. “There is a clear link between poor attendance at school and lower academic achievement.
